This may not be a solution to all your accommodation questions, but may point you in the right direction.


This booklet also covers other services that can help you access things you may need, for example employment, education, training, money and health clinics.




A PLACE OF YOUR OWN



FAMILY AND FRIENDS

This is a good option when you find yourself without a place to stay. Have a chat to any family or friends who you think may be willing to have you stay at their place for a while, or they may know somewhere else you can stay.



SHARED ACCOMMODATION

Share accommodation is where you share a house with other people. Sharing a home has its ups and downs but is cheaper than living alone.



- **HYPYA**

HYPYA, standing for Helping Young People Achieve, provides a wide range of support to young people to find and harness their talent for a positive future.

- **Get-A-Place (GAP)**

GAP offer a free workshop called 'Rent Club'. Rent Club is available to young people between the ages of 17 – 25 years. The workshop covers topics such as tenants rights and responsibilities, budgeting and how to access a private rental property.

Each person that completes the workshop is given a certificate which can be used as a reference to give landlords. Phone 8405 8580 for more information on the 'Rent Club.'

- **HYPYA House Hunt**

House Hunt is a program run twice a week to assist young people who are looking to move into private rental or shared accommodation, search and apply for properties. There are staff on board to assist you in this process, you can also access our facilities such as internet, phones, faxes, photocopier etc...

House Hunt is currently held every Monday and Friday in the HYPYA Youth Street Library, 135 Currie Street, Adelaide from 11am to 1pm. Days and times of availability are subject to change, please contact the Project Officer on 08 8405 8580 to find out more and secure your place!

Private rental is not always easy or quick to get but there are a variety of options available to you.

- **THE NEWSPAPER**

Check daily listings of rental properties in The Advertiser and your local newspaper. Wednesdays and Saturdays usually have the most listings.

- **REAL ESTATE AGENTS**

Most local real estate agents will have listings of private rental properties available. It is a good idea to register with real estate agents in the areas that you want to live.

- **ONLINE**

If you do not have a computer, you can still access the internet through libraries, your school or workplace, through friends or relatives or through some services (such as HYPA). There are also a number of internet cafés located in Adelaide that charge a fee to use the internet. Some good websites to try are:

TEMPORARY ACCOMMODATION



CARAVAN PARKS

This can be a fairly expensive option but a number of caravan parks are located throughout Adelaide and regional South Australia where you can stay for either a short or long term period. The advantage is that they usually have their own kitchen facilities and can sleep a larger number of people, however bathrooms are usually shared.

BACKPACKERS AND HOSTELS

Some hostels are only available for international travellers so make sure you ask. There are a number of backpacker's lodges in the Adelaide city.

BOARDING HOUSES


Boarding houses can be a small home with only a few people living there or they can be big houses, sometimes with many levels.

Generally everyone has their own fully furnished room and living areas are communal. Full board is provided at some boarding houses which means you get three meals a day and other costs (e.g. gas, electricity, cleaning) are included in the rent.

Make sure you ask what is included in the price, what is in the room and about any "house rules". There are a number of boarding houses located throughout Adelaide.

PUBLIC HOUSING

HOUSING SA

Housing SA may be able to assist you when you are looking for accommodation by:

Providing you with assistance towards paying a bond and up to two weeks rent in advance for private rental properties.

Connecting you in with a private rental liaison officer if you are having difficulty accessing private rental properties.

Discuss going on a waiting list for accommodation through the Youth Priority Housing Scheme (direct lease) or through the general Housing SA waiting list, depending on your level of assessed need.

Remember that Housing SA has a high demand for their properties and therefore the waiting lists for accommodation can be very long. Even if you are assessed as needing emergency accommodation you may still have to wait a number of months before you are housed.

You can either contact Housing SA on 13 12 99 or you can drop into a Housing SA office to make an appointment.


ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for Housing SA assistance you must:

- Have lived in SA for greater than six weeks
- Have your own income (employment or Centrelink allowance)





COMMUNITY HOUSING

COMMUNITY HOUSING ORGANISATIONS

Community housing organisations are run by members of the community rather than real estate agents, private landlords or Housing SA. Most community housing associations have fairly long waiting lists (at least 12 months) and you may need to keep in touch with them during this time to stay on the waiting list. Community housing organisations usually have very affordable rent as they are designed to provide safe and affordable housing for people on low incomes or with special needs. Often rent is fixed at a certain percentage of people's total income.

Community housing associations often cater for specialised groups of people and their needs.

HOUSING CO-OPERATIVES

Housing co-operatives are groups of community minded people who administer the housing that they live in. The co-operative own the housing rather than the individuals that make up the co-operatives.

This means that the landlord of the properties is usually all of the tenants as a group. Living in co-operative housing may place some additional expectations on you compared to living in private rental. For example, you may have to attend group meetings, have assigned jobs or maintain a communal garden area.

EMERGENCY ACCOMMODATION

Trace-A-Place is a service aimed specifically at young people aged between 15-25 in South Australia who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. This includes young parents with accompanying children.

Referred to as the Youth Gateway to crisis accommodation, Trace-A-Place offers a combination of services, including referrals to emergency and longer term youth specific housing, provision of information on sourcing and accessing safe accommodation options, and general support and guidance on dealing with the experience of homelessness.

During out of business hours for Trace-A-Place, the Homelessness Gateway Service is the contact point for crisis accommodation needs. Freecall 1800 003 308.

OUTREACH ACCOMMODATION

Outreach is also a form of supported accommodation involving young people living independently with minimal support. A support worker visits the person on a regular basis and provides support with living skills such as budgeting and accessing services that they may need. This service is to assist people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless to maintain a successful tenancy.

Outreach properties are located across Adelaide and are similar to renting in the private rental market, so rent, food and bills need to be budgeted for.

You do not need a referral to get an interview for outreach accommodation but you can talk to Trace-A-Place for further information and they can support you to contact them or make a referral on your behalf.



FLEXIBLE LEARNING OPTIONS (FLO)

Flexible Learning Options (FLO) is a SA State Government funded program targeted at young people from year 5 schooling level to 19 years of age who are at risk of leaving school early or who have left school without completing year 12 or its vocational equivalent.

The program offers alternative enrolment options, including students remaining at (or returning to) school, working one-on-one with a dedicated case manager, attending TAFE or similar or a combination of options. The exact structure used is flexible and designed to suit the individual student.
