## Course Overview

Building Links is designed to give students hands-on experience by renovating and remodelling existing Housing SA properties. This course combines structured workplace training at a live construction site, practical work sessions and theory. You will learn about the processes, materials, tools and equipment used and develop specialised skills and knowledge associated with construction industry.

## Skills

This course combines structured workplace training at a live construction site, practical work sessions and theory.

You will develop skills and knowledge, including:

- Practical experience in construction
- General use of construction tools and equipment
- Understanding of work place requirements in the construction industry

## Career Pathways

Skills achieved will assist students in undertaking a Certificate III or entering an Australian Apprenticeship in the building and construction industry.

## Delivery

This course is delivered one day per week from 8:30am to 3pm for the full school year. Commences Week 1, Term 1 2022. High visibility tops and basic personal protective equipment is provided. Students will need their own steel capped work boots and other appropriate clothing. Day to be confirmed on acceptance of enrolment.

## Cost

Schools are to pay \$220.

## Pre-requisites

CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry (White Card) must be achieved before students can access the live construction site.

Students must be 15 years or older. Maximum class size is 12. Course details are subject to change. Guardians, students and VET Coordinators are advised to confirm course details with the host school.
